<u>Brian</u> presented information on the Division IV soil sample project to gather viable information on cover crops to be able to present at the Workshops. In our District it was decided a dry farm and two rotation practices on opposite ends of the county would be of value. <u>Russ</u> volunteered his dry farm, <u>Luke</u> to the East and <u>Brian</u> to the West volunteered their rotation practice farms for this 5-year project. <u>Carolyn</u> will assist in evaluation of data.

Water Quality -Student project... KMVT will match advertising money used in their station, we just need to contact <u>Scott Peirce</u> in the sales department (208 933 2826) he suggested at least \$1000. Up front money to use just for advertising through them. The plan is to have a senior use this for their project.

Trees, we bagged them and they are in the process of being picked up.

<u>David</u> reported that it looks like about \$65.00 for nematode testing for a beet/potato field for <u>Blake Hansen</u> that the District is being asked to cover.
